Silver Birch

Welcome back!

This term our topic will be Tremendous Travellers where we will be travelling back in time to the Industrial Revolution and finding out how the railways were a significant turning point in British history. Our English work will link to this through poetry, classic fiction and picture books. In science we will be learning about sound, light and earth and space.

Homework

Reading: Our aim is for everyone to love reading but this doesn't happen by accident! Please listen to your child/children read and enjoy sharing books with them. It really does make such a difference to their progress and success. In Silver Birch, I check diaries every Monday and children are rewarded with a stamp in their reward book if they have read at least three times and had their diary signed by you. Their diary is an important and useful link between home and school.

Spellings: Spelling are given every fortnight and these need to be learnt "little and often" during that period. The children will usually be asked to either find definitions or write sentences with their spellings so that they are using them in context and understanding them. A dictionary at home will be very useful. Their knowledge of spelling patterns and word list words is built up over the years so that by Year 6 the children are prepared for the SATs spelling test and can spell most words accurately in their writing. Again it is really important that time is spent at home on spellings. I will let you know via their diary how they have got on with their spelling test.

Maths: Maths homework will usually be to learn key instant recall facts which the children need to know and be able to use quickly such as multiplication tables. In the National Curriculum pupils should know all multiplication tables up to 12 x 12 by the end of year 4 so they will need to practice these and other key facts at home at home.

Purple Mash: This has a wealth of activities that the children can enjoy to enhance their learning and develop their understanding of areas we are working on at school, if they have access to a computer.

Sycamore Class

The mornings in Sycamore Class have a focus on English and Maths. We begin each day with a reading time; this also gives the children the opportunity to change their school reading book whenever they need to.

Each fortnight the children are given a new spelling list and they are assessed every Monday (one week the spellings and the following week the spellings used in context). Please help your child to learn their spellings.

Monday is P.E day. Please ensure the children bring a suitable kit and footwear.

The topic this term is Tremendous Travelling' with a focus on finding out about changes

The Science work is all about 'Seasonal Changes'.

Cherry Tree Class

This half term in Cherry Tree class we will be continuing with child initiated learning throughout the areas of development. We will be reading the story of 'The Gruffalo' and partaking in various activities focused around the story. We have started Phase 2 phonics, Letters and Sounds and individual reading books. We are also developing our early maths skills showing a particular interest in numbers and shapes.

All the children have settled brilliantly back into school.

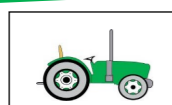
