Toys in School

We have a number of Children who like to bring toys to school. Can you please discourage your child to do so – upset occurs when the toy gets lost or damaged (and time is wasted when looking for them). We have plenty of resources the children can use at playtime. Any toys that escape from the house are kept in school bags or the classroom and are not to be taken out during playtimes. It is understandable that some children in Nursery and Reception like to bring in a toy – but this is to be kept in the classroom. Thank you

Play Equipment

Can I please remind all children and parents that the playtime play equipment including the climbing frames, is not to be used before or after school (before 8.55am at dropping off time, after 3.15pm at home time). We do not have the staff to supervise. Thank you.

Snack Money

Children are allowed 20p to buy a snack at morning break time, please send this with your child in a named purse.

Reading Certificates

Your child should have a school planner; we record details of the children's reading, homework activities and achievements in this planner. We ask you to write in the planner every time you listen to your child read. When your child has completed 25, 50, 75.....200 home reads they get their certificates signed. The certificates are in the back of the planner. At the end of the school year, all the children who have achieved 200 or more home reads get a reward.

Silver Birch Information

Silver Birch

Welcome back: I hope you've had a lovely summer break.

This term in Silver Birch we will be learning about rocks and materials in Science, Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age in history and Place knowledge and fieldwork in Geography. We will be visiting Sutton Bank to learn more about these outside of the classroom. The class texts that I will be using for our English work are linked to these topics.

I will also be focusing on developing understanding and fast recall of multiplication and division facts in Maths as these are so important in underpinning other mathematical concepts. Please support your child/children in learning and practising these.

Another area for focus will be the development of vocabulary as "words unlock learning." Hopefully your children will come home with some amazing new vocabulary which they can use confidently.

Homework

Reading: Our aim is for everyone to love reading but this doesn't happen by accident! Please listen to your child/children read and enjoy sharing books with them. This can really help with developing vocabulary too, as you can discuss a few special words and talk about why they are used. It really does make such a difference to their progress and success at the end of this Key Stage. In Silver Birch I check diaries every Monday and children are rewarded with a stamp in their reward book if they have read at least three times and had their diary signed by you. Their diary is an important and useful link between home and school, so please use it and encourage them to read frequently.

Spellings: Spelling are given every fortnight and these need to be learnt "little and often" during that period. The children will usually be asked to either find definitions or write sentences with their spellings so that they are using them in context and understanding them. A dictionary at home will be very useful. Their knowledge of spelling patterns and word list words is built up over the years so that by Year 6 the children are prepared for the SATs spelling test and can spell most words accurately in their writing. Again, it is really important that time is spent at home on spellings. I will let you know via their diary how they have got on with their spelling test.

Maths: Maths homework will usually be to learn and practice multiplication and division facts and other key facts. We have regular times tables tests and again I will let you know via their diary how they have done.

Purple Mash: This has a wealth of activities that the children can enjoy to enhance their learning and develop their understanding of areas we are working on at school, if they have access to a computer.

PE: This will be on Tuesday afternoons in KS2 except for the 24th September as this is our trip day. PE will be on Monday that week.

Reading in the classroom

We read every morning (9:00 – 9:15) apart from Friday. This has proven very successful in raising reading standards. If you can spare some time to come in and listen to a child read and talk to them about their book please see me (or just come in!). It really is very valuable so I would be very grateful.
